Safety and Usage Guidelines

WARNING: a lit candle must always be supervised.



Tips for lighting



Place your candle on a stable, draught-free surface, out of the reach of children and pets. Do not place another candle nearby.

We advise you to place your candle on a flat, stable, fire-resistant surface, away from any flammable materials (fabric curtains, wooden objects, etc.). Do not place it on a shelf.



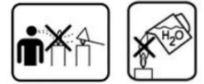
Once all the wicks are lit, allow your candle to burn until the top surface becomes liquid up to 1 cm. Otherwise, your candle may tunnel, forming craters and leaving wax deposits on the sides, reducing its visual appeal.

If the flame touches or comes close to the walls of the container, extinguish the candle and adjust the wick before relighting it for the next use.

Never burn your candle for more than one hour once the wax surface is fully melted to prevent the container from overheating.

Tips for Extinguishing the Flame

To extinguish your candle, do not pour any liquid or blow on the wicks. Instead, use a candle snuffer.



Before the wax solidifies, reposition the wicks to their original place to prevent them from touching the walls of the container when relit.

Once the candle is extinguished, the container will remain hot until the wax solidifies. Do not touch or move it during this time.



Maintenance tips

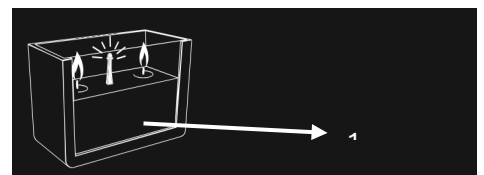
Regularly clean the inside of your candle with a non-alcoholic product to avoid soot buildup, which could create smoke and reduce the visibility of the photo or monument.

Trim the wick to between **0.8 cm and 1 cm** to prevent black smoke and soot deposits on the container's edges. Never leave wick remains or matches in the wax, as they could ignite and darken the wax.



Safety tips

Never burn the last centimeter of wax to avoid overheating the container or having the flame burn against the plastic. This could cause deformation or ignition of the container.



Candle storage tips

When not in use, do not place your candle near a heat source (window, glass door, fireplace, radiator, etc.) to prevent its visual appearance from degrading. Store it in a dry place at room temperature.
